Daily Rosary in May

That is not true. I, myself, have gained a new appreciation for the Rosary since this pandemic

began. I join the Archdiocese every night at 8pm to pray with close to 2,000 other people. Knowing that we are all praying together is a powerful thing.

As a result of our parish staff meeting, Nativity will host our own parish Rosary every day at 4pm during the month of May. It is my hope that many from of our parish community will join us to pray the Rosary.

Unfortunately, we cannot gather to honor Mary with a May Procession this year. However, we are planning a May Crowning ceremony in the church that will be live-streamed for our parish to participate in online. When the date is confirmed, I will send it out to the whole parish.

The Carnival

Sadly, the carnival will have to be postponed. I have been in consultation with our Carnival Chairperson, the Finance Council, the Pastoral Council and Warminster Township. It is the consensus that we have to postpone. At this time, I cannot offer any further information about rescheduling.

Along these lines, the Memorial Day Picnic will be canceled this year. Even if there is a parade, there is no way we can keep social distancing while offering food and drink like we normally do.

The Pastoral Council has begun to think of a way the parish can come together for a fun event when this is all over.

who may be living alone and to connect with them. I will let you know more as it develops.
